

- 1    **crēdō, -ere, crēdī, creditum**, to believe. This verb normally governs a dative in classical Latin with persons or words, but *in* + acc. with facts. **omnipotens, -entis**, all-powerful. **creator, -ōris** *m.* creator, father, founder.
- 2    **ūnicus, -a, -um**, one and only, sole; singular, unique.
- 3    **concipiō, -ere, -cēpi, -ceptum**, to take in, imagine, conceive. **nascor, nascī, nātus sum**, to be born. **virgō, -inis** *f.* maiden. **patior, patī, passum sum**, to suffer, endure, bear.
- 4    \***crucifigō, -ere, -fixi, -fixum**, to crucify. Classical usage knew *cruce adfigere*. Supply *est* with this verb and those following. **moriō, morī, mortuus sum**, to die. **sepeliō, -ire, sepēlivī, sepultum**, to bury. **inferī, -ōrum** *m.pl.* the dead; the Underworld. **tertius, -a, -um**, third.
- 5    **resurgō, -ere, -surrexi, -surrectum**, to rise again. **dextra, -ae**, right hand (also *dextera*).
- 6    **inde**, from where, whence. **ventūrus est**: future active periphrastic. **iudicō (I)** to judge. Note the post-classical use of an infinitive to express purpose. **vivus, -a, -um**, living, alive. Here a substantive.
- 7    **sanctus, -a, -um**, sacred, holy. **ecclēsia, -ae** ( $\tau\mu\eta\pi\pi\int\leq\phi i\partial\int$ ) assembly of the people; \*congregation, \*church. \***catholicus, -a, -um** ( $\Pi\int\psi\Delta\int\partial\Pi\Delta\int$ ) universal; orthodox. **sanctorum**: “of the holy ones” (a substantive from the adjective *sanctus* ).
- 8    **communiō, -iōnis** *f.* a sharing in common; \*union (of Christians). **remissiō, -iōnis** *f.* a letting go, release, remission. **peccātum, -ī**, wrongdoing, sin. **carō, carnis** *f.* flesh, meat. \***resurrectiō, -iōnis** *f.* resurrection.
- 10    **factor, -ōris** *m.* batsman; \*creator.
- 11    \***visibilis, -e** visible, seen.
- 12    **ūnigenitus, -a, -um**, only-begotten, only child. Classical Latin would use *ūnicus*.
- 13    **saeculum, -ī**, century, age.
- 14    **lumen, -inis** *n.* light. **vērus, -a, -um**, true, real. **gignō, -ere, genuī, genitum**, to beget, produce, give birth to; *pass.* to be born.
- 15    **consubstantialis, -e**, co-substantial.
- 16    **salūs, -ūtis** *f.* health, safety, welfare; \*salvation.
- 17    \***incarnō (I)** to make flesh, incarnate.
- 18    **etiam**, also.
- 19    **secundum** + *acc.* according to, in accordance with. **scriptūra, -ae**, writing, written work, composition; \**pl.* the Scriptures.
- 20    **dextera, -ae**, right hand (also *dextra*).
- 21    **iterum** *adv.* again.
- 23    \***vivificans, -antis**, animating, making alive, giving life.
- 25    **prōcēdō, -ere, -cessi, -cessum**, to go forth.
- 25    **simul** *adv.* at the same time. **adörō (I)** to entreat, beseech; adore, worship. \***conglorificō (I)** to glorify along with (another).
- 26    **prophēta, -ae** *m.* prophet.
- 27    \***apostolicus, -a, -um** ( $\dot{\tau}\tilde{\eta}\div\Delta\phi\Delta\int\partial\Pi\Delta\int$ ), having to do with the Apostles; concerning the bishops.
- 28    **confiteor, -ēri, -fessus sum**, to confess, admit. **baptisma** *n.* ( $\phi\dot{\tau}\epsilon\div\dot{\tau}\partial\phi\int$ ) baptism.
- 29    **expectō (I)** to wait for, await, look out for. **ventūri saeculi**: “of the age to come”.

- 31 **quicunque, quaecumque, quodcumque**, whosoever. **vult**: from *volö, velle, voluï*, to want, wish. **salvus, -a, -um**, well, sound, safe. **ante omnia**: “before all things,” “above all”. **opus est**, it is necessary. \***catholicus, -a, -um**, universal, catholic.
- 33 **quam**: the antecedent is *fidem*. **nisi**, unless, except. **quisque**, each, each one. **integer, -gra, -grum**, whole, intact, complete. **inviolatus, -a, -um**, inviolate, unhurt. **servö (I)** to keep, save, preserve. **absque + abl.** without, apart from. *absque dubio*: “without a doubt”.
- 34 **in aeternum**: “for all time,” “eternally”. **pereö, -ire, -ii, -itum**, to perish.
- 35 \***Trinitas, -ätis** f. the Trinity.
- 36 **unitas, -ätis** f. oneness, unity. **veonor, -äri, -atus sum**, to venerate, worship, revere.
- 37 **confundö, -ere, -füdi, -füsum**, to pour together, blend, mingle; confuse. **persöna, -ae**, mask, part, character; personality, person. **substantia, -ae**, substance, essence. \***seperö (I)** to separate, divide, distinguish.
- 38 **alius, alia, aliud**, other, another. **enim**, indeed. **spiritus, -üs m.** spirit; ghost.
- 39 **una**: read with *divinitas* (recall that Latin often separates adjectives from the nouns they modify). **divinitas, -ätis** f. divinity, godhead. **aequalis, -e**, equal.
- 40 \***coeterus, -a, -us**, co- eternal. **mäiestas, -ätis** f. majesty, dignity, grandeur.
- 41 **qualis . . . talis**: such . . . so. \***increatus, -a, -um**, uncreated.
- 43 **immensus, -a, -um**, immense, immeasurable.
- 44 **aeternus, -a, -um**, eternal.
- 46 **sicut**, just as, just as though; so to speak, as it were.
- 48 **similiter** *adv.* likewise, in the same fashion. **omnipotens, -antis**, all-powerful, omnipotent.
- 55 **quia** because. **singillatim**, one by one, singly. **unusquisque** (usually *unus quisque*), every one individually; every single one.
- 56 **confiteor, -äri, -fessus sum**, to confess, admit. **christianus, -a, -um**, Christian. **veritas, -ätis** f. truth. **compleö, -ere, -ëvi, -ëtum**, to fill up, complete. **trës**: accusative plural. Review the declension of *trës, trës, tria*.
- 57 **catholica religione**: ablative of means. **prohibeö, -ere, -ui, -itum**, to hold back, prohibit, prevent.
- 58 **ä nullö**: “by no one” (an ablative of personal agent). **creö (I)** to create. **gignö, -ere, genui, genitum**, to beget, bear, produce.
- 59 **solus, -a, -um**, sole, alone.
- 61 **procödö, -ere, -cessi, -cesum**, to go forth, proceed.

- 64 **prius** *adv.* earlier, before. **posterior** *adv.* later, after. **maius**: “greater”. Review the comparative of *magnus*, -*a*, -*um*: *maior*, *maius*. **minus**: “lesser”. Review the comparative of *parvus*, -*a*, -*um*: *minor*, *minus*.
- 65 **sibi**: “with each other” (dative of reference). **coaequālis**, -*e*, co-equal.
- 66 **ita ut**: “so that”. **per omnia**: “in all things”. **sicut**, just as, as. **suprä** *adv.* above, earlier. **unitas**, -*atis* *f.* oneness, unity.
- 67 **veneror**, -*äri*, -*atus sum*, to venerate, worship, revere. Note the future passive periphrastic conjugation.
- 68 **vult**: from *volö*, *velle*, *voluï*, to want, wish. **salvus**, -*a*, -*um*, safe, sound. **ita**, thus, so, in this manner. **sentiö**, -*ire*, **sensi**, **sensum**, to feel, perceive, think, judge.
- 69 **necessarius**, -*a*, -*um* necessary. **ad**: “for” (almost the equivalent of a purpose clause). **salus**, -*ütus* *f.* safety, salvation. \***incarnatiö**, -*iönis* *f.* incarnation. **quoque**, also.
- 70 **fideliter** *adv.* faithfully, loyally. **credö**, -*ere*, **credidö**, **creditum**, to believe (with accusative of thing and dative of person).
- 71 **rectus**, -*a*, -*um*, straight, upright, correct. **confiteor**, -*ëri*, -*fessus sum*, to confess, admit. **quia**: “that” (introducing indirect speech in post-classical Latin).
- 73 **substantia**, -*ae*, substance, essence. **saeculum**, -*i*, age, century, time. **gignö**, -*ere*, **genuï**, **genitum**, to beget, bear, bring forth.
- 74 **nascor**, **nasci**, **natus sum**, to be born.
- 75 **anima**, -*ae*, spirit. \***rationälis**, -*e*, rational. **carö**, **carnis** *f.* flesh, meat.
- 76 **subsistö**, -*ere*, -*stiti*, to stand; make a stand; stop, halt; remain.
- 77 **aequālis**, -*e*, equal. **secundum** + *acc.* according to, with respect to. **divinitas**, -*ätis* *f.* divinity, godhead.
- 78 **humanitas**, -*ätis* *f.* humanity.
- 79 **licet**: this word sometimes loses its verbal forces and becomes a pure conjunction with the meaning “although”. It then governs a verb in the subjunctive. **et**: “also”.
- 80 **conversiö**, -*iönis* *f.* a turning, a rounding off; \*conversion, transformation. **assumptiö**, -*iönis* *f.* assumption, a taking up.
- 82 **omnинö** *adv.* entirely, altogether, wholly. **confusiö**, -*iönis* *f.* a mixing together, confusion. **unitas**, -*ätis* *f.* unity.
- 83 **sicut**, just as.
- 85 **patior**, **pati**, **passus sum**, to suffer; endure; allow, permit. **descendö**, -*ere*, -*i*, -*sum*, to go down, descend. **inferni**, -*örum*, the dead; the Underworld. **tertiä die**: an ablative of time when. **resurgö**, -*ere*, -*surrexii*, -*surrectum*, to rise again.
- 86 **mortuus**, -*a*, -*um*, dead (here used substantively).
- 87 **ascendö**, -*ere*, -*i*, -*sum*, to go up, ascend. **sedeö**, -*ere*, **sedi**, **sessum**, to sit. **dextera**, -*ae*, right hand. **inde** *adv.* from there, whence.
- 88 **iudicö** (1) to judge. Note the post-classical use of an infinitive to express purpose. **vivus**, -*a*, -*um*, alive, living (here used substantively).
- 89 **adventus**, -*üs* *m.* arrival. **resurgere habent**: “they have to rise”.
- 90 **reddö**, -*ere*, -*didi*, -*ditum*, to give back, return; render (an account). **prorius**, -*a*, -*um*, own, pertaining to one's self. **ratiö**, -*iönis* *f.* account, rendering.
- 91 **bona**: “good things” (a substantive).
- 93 \***catholicus**, -*a*, -*um*, universal. **nisi**, except that, unless. **quisque**, **quaeque**, **quidque**, each. **fideliter** *adv.* faithfully, loyally.
